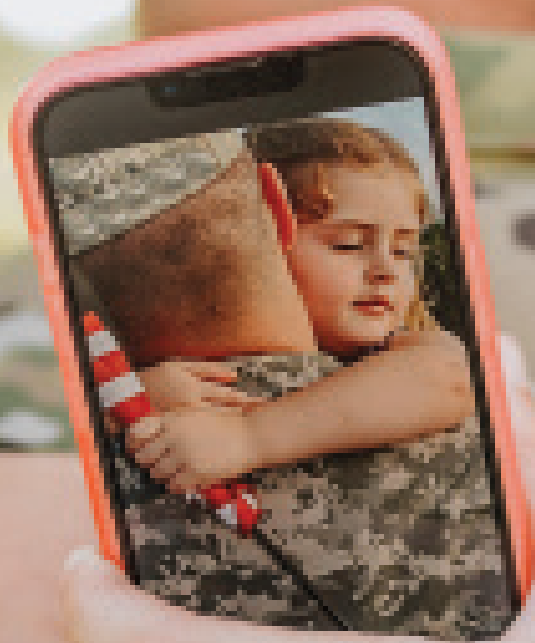

Providing Support Across Decades: Alyssa's Story

From Our Cover: Alyssa (now 16) has received Our Military Kids activity awards throughout her father's National Guard deployments that began in 2012.

When Alyssa was eight years old, her father left for his first overseas deployment with the U.S. Army National Guard. To help her stay active and engaged during his absence, her mother, Erica, applied for an Our Military Kids activity award through information received from her Family Readiness Group.

That first activity award funded swimming lessons for Alyssa, giving her both a healthy outlet and confidence-building skills as she awaited her father's return home.

Now 16, Alyssa has experienced two more of her father's deployments alongside her mother and 11-year-old sister, Morgan. Through the years, Our Military Kids has continued to provide support for their family. In 2023, both sisters received activity awards to cover volleyball fees. The following year, Morgan chose tumbling while Alyssa pursued her passion for marching band and winter drumline.

"Alyssa has persevered through all three deployments," Erica told us. "She joined the marching band to play the drums like her daddy did when he was in high school. She has been a role model for her younger sister, who has only been through two of his deployments so far, showing her how to navigate acclimating to life without their daddy."

With the support of their activity awards, Alyssa and Morgan have found joy, connection, and new skills as they weathered each send-off and separation. Their family's story reflects the strength and resilience of thousands of military children who, over the past two decades, have thrived with the opportunities made possible by Our Military Kids.

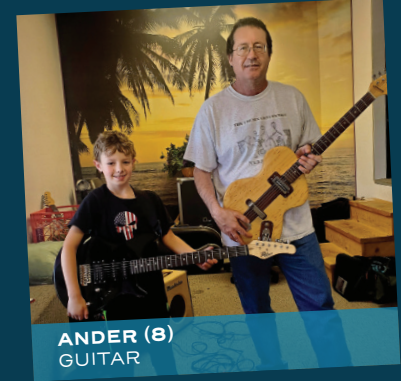

BOB WOODRUFF FOUNDATION'S STAND UP FOR HEROES

Eddie and Joanie Bailey, an Our Military Kids beneficiary family, were highlighted at the Bob Woodruff Foundation's 18th Annual Stand Up for Heroes celebration in New York City to honor Veterans and their families on Veterans Day.

Military spouse Joanie Bailey shared, "When Eddie deployed, it hit our youngest son really hard. He didn't want to go to school and he had night terrors. **I felt so alone. I didn't know how to fix it.**

His therapist said **he needed something he loves, something he can control.** That thing was football, but **we just couldn't afford it.** We applied for a grant from Our Military Kids so he could play. And that program saved him. He had mentors, father figures, friends that came back season after season. He had consistency. And I had support. I felt seen."

Army National Guardsman Eddie Bailey added, "When Aidan was struggling, Joanie didn't tell me at first. When she did, I was super worried, spiraling, questioning my decisions, wondering if he would be okay. When Our Military Kids stepped in, just knowing this organization was helping take care of my family while I was gone was a huge relief. It allowed me to refocus and re-engage with my job and did wonders for my own mental health."

"Both of my kids, Ryne and Sophie, received grants that will go toward their hockey registration. I am a 27-year Navy Reserve Veteran. Both of my kids have played hockey since they were five. While deployed it was tough being away from the two of them. I looked forward to returning home just in time for hockey season to start. I am a coach for my daughter's team, but I enjoy watching them both play. These activity grants are very thoughtful, as they allowed me to worry less about the cost of hockey while I was deployed and more about the enjoyment of the game for the kids."

SPORTS FOR SON OF VETERAN WITH COMBAT-RELATED ILLNESS

Joaquin (17) received his first Our Military Kids activity award to cover sports conditioning when he was eight years old. Since then, Joaquin has received multiple activity awards to fund his love for sports, including baseball and football, while his Army Veteran father received care for his combat-related illness.

“Playing sports is now most important to Joaquin because he knows it makes his dad happy,” his mother told us. “This is his outlet and a way for Joaquin and his father to share time together. We weren’t sure if we could afford his football this year. Our Military Kids activity awards are important and needed for situations like this.”

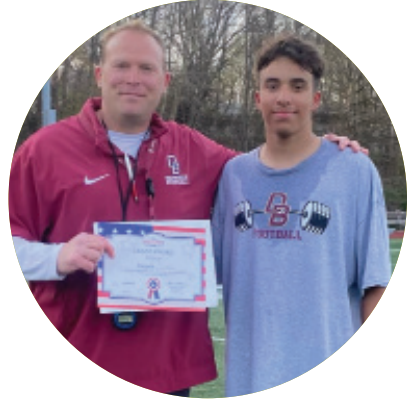


These opportunities have opened even more doors for Joaquin, as he is being recruited to play football and baseball at a variety of colleges.

“Joaquin has grown up seeing the effects of his father’s PTSD,” said his mother. “This was difficult for him when he was younger as he did not know the cause, but he saw that **at games and practices my husband was the most attentive and the happiest.** They have bonded over how well Joaquin is doing in sports and now bond in visiting colleges and just talking about plays, at bats, and becoming a young man.

Joaquin loves sports — they have been his outlet for not only his learning disability but also as a way for Joaquin and his father to share time together. Sports are where he excels and feels like he is a normal kid. **Sports, particularly football and baseball, give him that normalcy.”**

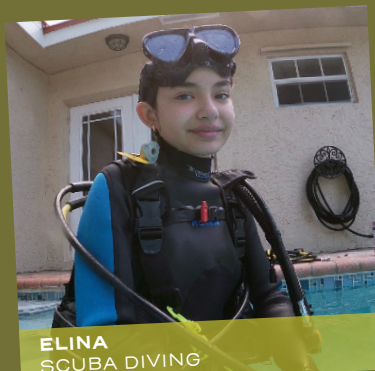

2024 marked the 16th year of the Our Military Kids Combat Injured Program, which funds activities for children of post-9/11 Veterans and service members of any branch who are receiving care for combat-related injuries or illnesses. During this time, Our Military Kids funded the activities that kept families connected to each other and their communities across all 50 states, DC, and the territories.

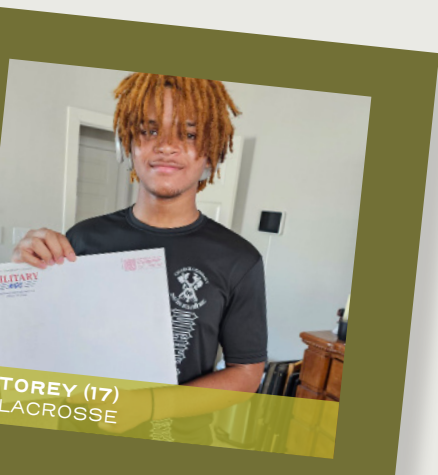

4th Annual Courageous Kids Contest

The 4th Annual Our Military Kids *Courageous Kids Contest* celebrated military children and teens from across the country who demonstrated extraordinary courage, resilience, and strength while experiencing a parent's National Guard or Reserve deployment or combat-injury care.

Courageous Kids Contest winners are selected from the branches of service represented in our Deployed Program (National Guard and Reserve) and our Combat Injured Program (every branch of service) and are announced every April in conjunction with the Month of the Military Child. The Hidden Helper Hero Award was introduced in 2022, and highlights military children who assist in caregiving duties for a combat-injured or ill parent.

The winners of the 2024 *Courageous Kids Contest* were selected by a committee of volunteers from hundreds of nominations submitted by family members, coaches, teachers, and friends. Winners each received a feature story on the Our Military Kids website and social media platforms, along with a \$300 cash stipend and award certificate.

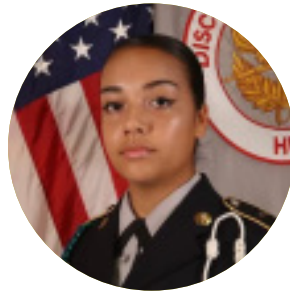

Ovation: A Celebration of 20 Years

For 20 years, Our Military Kids has recognized the sacrifice of military families by paying for their children's activities while a parent is deployed with the National Guard, deployed with the Reserve, or receiving care for post-9/11, combat-related injuries or illness.

Our 20th anniversary *Ovation* event, held on September 12th, 2024, at the Planet Word Museum in Washington, DC, was a critical component in furthering our mission for decades to come. *Ovation* brought together government and military leaders, including Members of Congress, mission sponsors, program partners, and Our Military Kids co-founders and beneficiary families for a packed house at a new DC venue. Guests toured the interactive museum galleries, enjoyed a fantastic offering of food and drink, and had a festive time while focusing on the impactful work of Our Military Kids.

During the reception, we honored the inaugural Our Military Kids Hall of Fame inductees. Special Honorees were selected for their selfless and tireless advocacy on behalf of families of deployed National Guard and Reserve service members and Veterans with combat-related injuries or illness. The Honorable Elizabeth Dole and LTG Roger Schultz (Ret) received inaugural namesake Leadership Awards, and the Honorable Trent Kelly, US House of Representatives (MS-1), received the Our Military Kids Military Community Service Award.

2024 Community Champions

DC BRITISH RELIABILITY RUN SETS NEW RECORD

The 2024 DC British Reliability Run (DCBRR) was one for the record books with 46 British car enthusiasts raising over \$80,000 in support of Our Military Kids, the event's highest total to date! Held each fall in scenic, rural Virginia and adjacent states, the DCBRR brings together classic car buffs for a weekend of driving, camaraderie, and giving back.

This year's event was made even more memorable by a special appearance from Our Military Kids beneficiary Xzavier, who has received activity awards for basketball. Xzavier shared his story during the kickoff breakfast, inspiring attendees with his energy and gratitude. Immediately after the event kickoff, he headed off to a basketball tournament in Baltimore, which his team won!

PARTNERSHIP WITH NATIONAL PARK TRUST

In our third year of partnering with the National Park Trust, Our Military Kids recipient families were invited to embark on five adventures at National Parks across the United States. These adventures included custom tours and activities at Mammoth Cave National Park in Kentucky, Golden Gate National Recreation Area and Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary in California, Zion National Park in Utah, and Indiana Dunes National Park in Indiana.

At each event, participating military families were presented with their free America the Beautiful Pass, which provides entrance or access to more than 2,000 federal recreational sites, including all National Park Service sites.



TNS GOLF TOURNAMENT CONTINUES TO DRIVE SUPPORT

Our Military Kids was proud to once again be a beneficiary of the Transaction Network Services (TNS) Charity Golf Tournament, held in September at The Golf Club at Creighton Farms in Aldie, Virginia. William (15), an OMK award recipient and Courageous Kids Contest Winner, served as the honorary starter. His father, a U.S. Marine Corps Veteran, enlisted just days after 9/11 and was injured during his third deployment to Iraq.



USAA AND KYLE HAMILTON TEAM UP TO SUPPORT OUR MILITARY KIDS

As part of the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats initiative, USAA partnered with Baltimore Ravens safety Kyle Hamilton to spotlight Our Military Kids and the strength of military children. Inspired by his own mother's experience growing up as a military child, Hamilton chose Our Military Kids as his cause.

Kyle and USAA then took the initiative a step further, providing several program beneficiaries with a memorable visit to the Ravens' practice facility with Kyle where they had a one-on-one Q and A, threw the football on the practice field, took to the hoops on the Ravens basketball court, and shared their stories with the NFL's rising star as he autographed their t-shirts and mini-Ravens helmets. My Cause, My Cleats provides significant awareness to Our Military Kids' mission and is just one component of USAA's support. USAA Foundation's 2024 grant allowed military children to participate in 667 activities, connecting children and families to community support and enhancing overall family wellbeing!

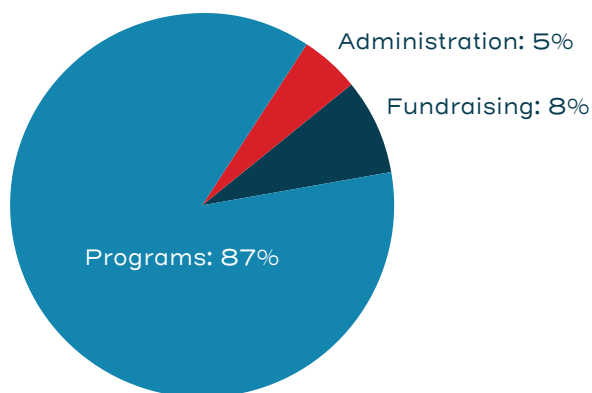

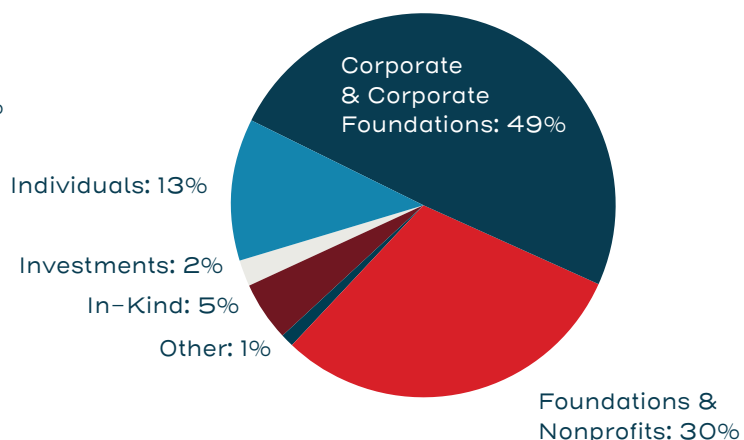

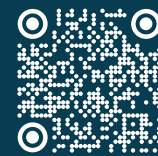
